Administration

[What do the Election Results Mean for the State of Afterschool?](#)

The [Afterschool Alliance](#) published a blog discussing what this year's midterm results could mean for afterschool. The blog also outlined newly elected officials who have proven to be champions of the afterschool field.

[Advice from Veteran Teachers](#)

[EducationWeek](#) asked veteran teachers "What are one to three things you would tell your first-year teacher self, and why would it/they be important to tell?" and posted the responses. The hope is to provide newer teachers and administrators with advice that can help them as they continue their career in education and youth development.

[How Chicago is Addressing Attendance In Schools](#)

The COVID-19 pandemic has negatively impacted students' attendance, and the [Chicago Public School district](#) is working to address this issue. Chicago Public Schools highlighted the work of Multi-Tiered System of Supports teams, on which educators and administrators monitor attendance, grades, and behavior for individual students to provide help to those who need it. The district said it's also leaning on stepped-up family outreach and expanded after-school programs to help reengage students.

The article noted that one sign of quality play is when children are interacting with materials and peers and are given different options for activities.

The article noted that one of the most powerful levers to increase student engagement and amplify learning is to ensure that learning experiences are reflective of students' lives.

[EducationWeek](#) discussed findings from a nationwide survey from the EdWeek Research Center. The findings reveal that the education system does not align with the interest of many students on the issue of climate change. Teens are eager to learn more about how climate change will affect the future of the Earth and society, and what they can personally do to lessen the effects. The vast majority of states do not require comprehensive instruction on the subject outside of high school science class.
