<u>President Trump's FY2021 Budget: Proposed Elimination of 21st</u> Century Community Learning Centers (CCLCs)

Today, the President released his proposed Budget for the Fiscal Year 2021 with the intention of eliminating funding for 21st Century Community Learning Centers (CCLC) programs. This means that going forward, approximately 1.7 million youth and their families nationwide will no longer have access to quality afterschool and summer programming. Legislators in Congress have the power to decide whether or not local programs will continue providing vital services to young folks *or* if they will close their doors and negatively impact our youth. ACT Now Coalition and its partner networks in the 50 states urge you to advocate for the reinstatement of 21st CCLC funding. To take action, click here. National Girls Collaborative Project: African American History Month

In recognition of African American History Month, the National Girls Collaborative Project has compiled resources that serve to promote African American students in STEM:

- Black Girls Code is designed to increase the number of young women of color in the field of digital and computer technology by providing skills, exposing them to technology role models, and increasing self-confidence to become tech creators and entrepreneurs.
- The Black Inventor Online Museum focuses on the ingenuity and accomplishments of the top black inventors over the last 300 years in a detailed exhibition. There is a specific section <u>dedicated to female</u> inventors.
- **Science NetLinks** has developed <u>a number of materials</u> that honor the achievements and scientific work of African Americans.
- Summer Engineering Experience for Kids (SEEK) is a program designed to expose black youth to STEM fields. SEEK utilizes student mentors, the

majority of whom are black and majoring in STEM fields. <u>The 2020 dates and locations are now available.</u>
