Federal Updates

Continuing Resolution Passed in House

On **February 8**, **2022**, the U.S. House of Representatives passed a three-week extension of government funding at fiscal year (FY) 2021 levels. This is in an effort to give Congress until **March 11**, **2022**, to finalize a package of FY 2022 funding bills. The U.S. Senate has until **February 18**, **2022**, to pass this continuing resolution (CR) before current funding expires.

Awaiting Federal Budget for Fiscal Year 2023

As Congress enacts another continuing resolution to push through FY 2022 funding legislation, the budgeting process for FY2023 will begin soon. The first step in this process is awaiting President Biden's budget proposal hopefully in March.

State Updates

New SNAP Retailers Approved for Illinois Families

On **February 10**, **2022**, Governor JB Pritzker and the <u>Illinois Department of Human Services</u> (<u>IDHS</u>) announced that the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) approved Sam's Club and Meijer Grocery for SNAP online purchasing. With these additions, Illinois LINK card users can now purchase groceries online through these chains across the state.

Illinois Plans to Lift the Indoor Mask Mandate

On February 9, 2022, Governor JB Pritzker announced that the State of Illinois plans to lift the indoor mask mandate on February 28, 2022. However, the announcement clarified that mask requirements will remain in locations where it is federally mandated, such as on public transit and in high-risk settings including healthcare facilities and congregate care. Masking requirements will also continue to apply in all daycare settings. The state intends to continue masking requirements in P-12 schools subject to pending litigation which impacts a number of schools. To learn more about this decision, click here.

Birth to Five Illinois Action Councils

Birth to Five Illinois is a new initiative from the state of Illinois. It launched in February 2022. There are several important goals for the work:

- To support local residents in coming together to address early childhood needs within their own communities
- To make sure the State's policies and funding priorities match the needs of each region, prioritizing voices of families, providers, and communities
- To provide equitable access to high-quality early childhood services for all children

The initiative is in the process of hiring a <u>Regional Action Council Manager</u> in each of the 39 regions, <u>currently excluding Chicago</u>. These managers will oversee the formation and ongoing operations of the regional Councils, including hiring the additional staff.

The initiative is also working to stand up <u>one</u> Birth to Five <u>Action Council</u> and one <u>Family Council</u> in <u>each</u> of the State's 39 regions, <u>currently excluding Chicago</u>. Each region's Action Council will have around fifteen members with a wide variety of experience. Each region's Family Council will have around 15 family members with young children and/or experience with Illinois' early childhood education and care services. CLARIFICATION: Reimagine Public Safety Act Grant for Eligible Chicago Neighborhoods

On February 2, 2022, the Illinois Department of Human Service's (IDHS) Office of Firearm Violence Prevention (OFVP) released the Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for violence prevention work within the 22 eligible communities in Chicago. A technical assistance session will be offered on February 17, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. for potential grantees. While this session is not mandatory, it is highly encouraged. Proposals are due March 9, 2022, at 12:00 p.m. CST. The NOFOs for youth development programming for communities in Chicago and municipal governments across the State of Illinois have not been released.

ACT Now has <u>updated our one-pager to reflect this clarification</u> and continues to partner with the Illinois Collaboration on Youth (ICOY) to provide capacity building technical assistance.

Family and Community Partnerships

The Charitable Trust Grant for Small Nonprofits

The Charitable Trust grant program is accepting applications from Illinois nonprofits with an annual budget of up to \$1 million. Organizations that provide services in three categories (Food Programs, Housing Programs, and Workforce and Economic Development) are eligible to apply. 10 nonprofits will receive up to \$20,000 each. **The deadline to apply is March 31, 2022.**
