Illinois Department of Public Health: COVID-19 Vaccination Sites Ready to Administer Pfizer Vaccine to Youth 12 to 15 Years Old

On **May 12, 2021,** the <u>Illinois Department of Public Health</u> (IDPH) announced vaccination locations across the state are prepared to administer the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine to young people ages 12 to 15 years old. Illinois Department of Public Health: \$225 Million Investment to Expand COVID-19 Testing in Middle and High Schools Statewide

Advance Illinois: Governor JB Pritzker Supports Evidence-Based Funding Formula for FY22

In early May, Governor JB Pritzker announced that he is in favor of appropriating \$350 million in general revenue funds for Evidence-Based Funding (EBF) for FY22. This appropriation will allow school districts across the state to invest in long-term supports and services for students. <u>The Federal Communications Commission</u> has established a temporary program to help families afford Internet service during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Emergency Broadband Benefit program provides a discount for eligible households and can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers. Eligible households can enroll through a <u>participating broadband provider</u> or directly with the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) using an <u>online or mail-in application</u>.
