Policy Updates

Federal Updates

<u>U.S. House Labor, Health, and Human Services Subcommittee: Increase to 21st Century Line Proposed!</u>

On **July 12, 2021**, the U.S. House Labor, Health, and Human Services, Education Subcommittee (LHHS-ED) proposed a \$100 million increase to the 21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st Century)

funding line. This is \$50 million more than President Biden's proposed FY22 budget for 21st Century. The U.S. House of Representatives and U.S. Senate will not vote on the FY2022 spending bill. Urge your legislators to vote yes!

State Updates

Illinois Department of Public Health: Updated School Guidance after CDC Announcement

On **July 9, 2021**, the <u>Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH)</u> announced that the state of Illinois will adopt the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) updated <u>guidance for COVID-19 Prevention in Kindergarten (K)-12 Schools</u> released earlier in the day. The updated school guidance now aligns with guidance for <u>fully vaccinated people</u>, which allows activities to resume for fully vaccinated people without wearing a mask except where required by federal, state, and local rules and regulations.

- Masks should be worn indoors by all individuals (age 2 and older) who are not fully vaccinated.
- CDC recommends schools maintain at least 3 feet of physical distance between students within classrooms, combined with indoor mask wearing by people who are not fully vaccinated, to reduce transmission risk. When it is not possible to maintain a physical distance of at least 3 feet, such as when schools cannot fully re-open while maintaining these distances, it is especially important to layer multiple other prevention strategies, such as indoor masking.
- Screening testing, ventilation, handwashing and respiratory etiquette, staying home when sick and getting tested, contact tracing in combination with quarantine and isolation, and cleaning and disinfection are also important layers of prevention to keep schools safe.

Chalkbeat Chicago: Chicago Public Schools to Open Three COVID-19 Vaccine Sites

On **July 7, 2021,** Chicago Public Schools (CPS) announced that the school district will hosting three COVID-19 vaccination sites for youth vaccinations starting this week. The locations include Chicago Vocational Career Academy in Avalon Park, Michele Clark High School in Austin, and Theodore Roosevelt High School in Albany Park. **Each site will be open weekdays from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. during the summer.** At those three locations, CPS aims to administer up to 600 first doses of the vaccine each week. Chicago Teachers Union (CTU) <u>proposed</u> that the school district to vaccinate 80% of students over 12 years old by **October 1, 2021,** utilizing a strategy of home visits and vaccine clinics on school grounds.
