### **Proposed Free Tuition for STEM Students**

In the hopes of filling empty factory jobs, the Illinois Manufacturers' Association is pushing a plan to waive tuition at state universities to students studying STEM subjects. The proposed plan would waive tuition and other fees at the University of Illinois and other state colleges and universities for students studying science, technology engineering or math who agree to teach in a state high school for at least three years after graduation, or a state institute of higher education for at least five years. WeGo Together for Kids is a collective impact community collaboration that facilitates community schools efforts within West Chicago Elementary School District 33. WeGo employs an asset-based community development framework to provide wraparound services to youth and their families, and highlights their mental health services delivery model as one of their best practices. By subcontracting with three local mental health organizations, WeGo is able to bring in
