Spotlight on Community Schools

WeGo Together for Kids

WeGo Together for Kids is a collective impact community collaboration that facilitates community schools efforts within West Chicago Elementary School District 33. Afterschool programs are a key part of the community schools

model, however community schools also offer various other human services to support their youth and families.

Not only does WeGo offer an excellent afterschool program, but they employ an asset-based community development framework to provide wraparound services for their community. WeGo highlights their mental health services delivery model as one of their best practices. By sub-contracting with three local mental health organizations, WeGo is able to bring in dedicated community mental health staff to support West Chicago families. These bilingual community mental health clinicians provide prevention, early intervention, home and community-based therapy, crisis intervention, and consultation to students, families, and District 33 staff.
