Blog: "Afterschool Deserts" in Illinois

Afterschool programs across our nation are doing incredible work and cover a wide array of services and outcomes. Yet the diversity in programming offerings can also make it difficult for program providers to define the value of their programs. In Illinois, Afterschool for Children and Teens Now (ACT Now) sought to solve this problem by creating our Illinois Afterschool Map and Database. Great START Wage Supplement Program

Great START (Strategy to Attract and Retain Teachers) is a wage supplement program that rewards eligible early care and education and school-age care practitioners who have completed college coursework, and stay at their current place of employment.
