## Federal Budget Update

On March 23rd, President Trump signed a \$1.3 trillion FY18 omnibus spending bill that will fund the government through September 30, 2018. The bill funds 21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st CCLC) at \$1.21 billion, an increase of \$20 million over the FY17 level. Other programs vital for children and families were also largely supported in the omnibus, including:

- Funding for the Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG), which supports low-income working families with quality child care, was increased by about \$2.37 billion for a total of \$5.3 billion.
- Funding for the Corporation for National and Community Service's AmeriCorps VISTA, a volunteer service program used by many afterschool programs, was sustained at \$92.364 million.
- Funding for Title IV Part A Student Support Academic Enrichment Grants, which
  provides all students with access to a well-rounded education, was allocated at \$1.1
  billion, which is a \$700 million increase over FY17.
- Funding for the Youth Mentoring Initiative was increased by \$14 million from FY17 for an allocation of \$94 million.

## Youth Budget Commission

HB5202 amends the Governor's Office of Management and Budget Act to establish a Youth Budget Commission. This Commission will create a yearly analysis of the State budget across six developmental goals that will be used to advise the administration on youth program policies and spending.
