### **Federal STEM, Computer Science Education Grants**

The U.S. Department of Education is accepting applications for two FY18 grant competitions that support increasing access to high quality Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) and Computer Science education programs. The grants available are as follows:

- \$75 million Supporting Effective Educator Development provides funding to increase the number of highly effective educators.
- \$120 million Education Innovation and Research provides funding to create, develop, implement, replicate, or take to scale entrepreneurial, evidence-based, field initiated innovations.
