

Policy Update

21st CCLC Funding

The 21st Century Community Learning Centers (CCLC) initiative is the only federally funded afterschool program. It serves 52,496 students in 456 communities in Illinois. Be advised of the following funding updates and opportunities to take action:

- The FY17 federal omnibus spending bill, <u>H.R. 244</u>, that includes a \$25 million increase for 21st CCLC was passed on May 5th.
- The President's FY18 budget proposal eliminates 21st CCLC. To call on Congress to protect funding for afterschool and summer learning programs in FY18, click here.
- ISBE is documenting how proposed cuts in federal funding for FY18 will affect Illinois schools and communities. Current 21st CCLC grantees are encouraged to share their programs' impact stories, data, and talking points for letters of support with their district superintendents.

Tell Policymakers to Release the 21st CCLC RFP

The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) is in the process of finalizing the next 21st Century RFP. We need you to tell your policymakers that the RFP needs to be released NOW in order to limit gaps in funding as much as possible. Illinois Budget Update

- On April 6th the Illinois House passed <u>HB109</u>, <u>HAM1</u>, which amends/repeals appropriations to the stopgap budget covering the first six months of FY17. The total appropriated for After School Youth Support Programs for the second half of FY17 is \$17,917,400. It is unclear at this time if the Senate will be moving forward with this bill.
- The Illinois Senate's \$36.5 billion FY17 supplemental spending plan and FY18 budget, <u>SB6</u>, passed on May 17th. The bill makes appropriations to agencies for

costs incurred prior to July 1, 2017 and includes roughly \$13.5 million in funding for Teen REACH. To read more about the Senate's legislation, click here.

Social Services Contract Notice

The Social Services Contract Notice Act, <u>HB3110</u>, is on its third reading in the Senate. This bill was written in response to the Good Friday social services cut that took place in April 2015. The bill would require the state of Illinois to provide the General Assembly and social service providers advance notice prior to reducing, eliminating, or suspending services. Thriving Youth Fund

The Thriving Youth Fund bill, <u>SB2046/HB3217</u>, passed out of the Senate and is now in the House. Trauma-Informed Care for Children and Families Act

The federal Trauma-Informed Care for Children and Families Act of 2017, S.774/H.R.1757, addresses the impact of toxic stress and trauma on childhood development.
