Illinois Budget Update

On May 31st, the Illinois General Assembly passed a budget, <u>HB109 Amendment</u> <u>2</u>. It will now be sent to the Governor to sign. For a full update on what this means for afterschool, click <u>here</u>.

Federal Budget Update

The U.S. House Appropriations Committee recently approved FY19 spending allocations for its 12 subcommittees. The plan freezes funding for Labor, Health and Human Services, Education (LHHS) which sets funding levels for all federal education, human service, health and labor programs and includes the 21st Century Community Learning Centers initiative. Meanwhile, the Senate Appropriations Committee approved \$179.3 billion for LHSS in their FY19 spending plan. This is roughly a \$2.2 billion increase compared to FY18. The FY19 budget deadline is September 30th.
